- 1. ADMISSION, BIDDER FEE AND RESERVED SEATS: All bidders must register (\$25.00). Bidder registration will be from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (Friday, August 4, Preview) and from 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, August 5. This admits two to the Museum, to the Preview, and to two seats in the Reserved Bidders' section. If you receive a catalogue in the mail, you must still register in order to bid (no additional fee). Upon registration, you will be given two seat tags and a bidder's card. Seats may be reserved by attaching the tags to seats in the special Bidders' section. Catalogs will be available for purchase through the Museum.
- 2. METHOD OF PAYMENT: All settlements will be made on the day of the sale by cash, certified or cashier's check, bank money order, personal check accompanied by an irrevocable Bank letter of credit presented on bank stationary, or pre-approved check. Your item purchased will not be released until collected U.S. funds are received. #### 1912 Stanley Model 63 4 Passenger Car

This Stanley 1912, Model 63, 4 passenger toy tonneau has a 20 hp engine. The VIN# is 6350 with an undocumented odometer reading of 63, 992 miles. The exterior of the car is green with yellow pinstriping and yellow wheels with a black convertible top. An older complete restoration was finished in April 2000 by C. Frank Hix, Jr. This vehicle has won numerous awards since restoration was completed including Senior Award Winner at Hershey. The overall condition of this car appears to be excellent. This car and related parts can be viewed in Estes Park, Colorado by appointment, after July 17, 2017.

The buyer will be responsible for pickup or shipment from Estes Park, Colorado.











#### 1919 Stanley Model 735B Touring Car

This 1919 Stanley Model 735, 7 passenger touring car has a VIN# of 19192. It has a 20 HP engine. The exterior body is green, the wheels are yellow and the convertible top is black. Overall the black interior appears to be in very good condition. An older complete restoration was finished in 1989 by C. # **1906 Stanley DX surrey side** bar tiller.

This Stanley DX has a body #1862, and engine #1121. This is an original body. The car was discovered in the 1960's by the Leonard brothers in a barn loft in Boston. It has  $30 \times 2$  tires, 18" boiler, and a  $3 \times 4$  10 HP engine.









#### 1923 Stanley Model 740B 5-passenger touring car 20hp Chassis #23588

This Stanley is nearly original. The car was last restored in 1959 and has held up rather well. New tires were put on in 1997 and have less than 100 miles on them. A new boiler was installed in 2001. The car runs and is ready to be enjoyed.

All the wood under the seats appears to be solid, and the seats themselves are clean and damage free. The vehicle is complete and ready to go. Not missing any parts or trim known.

The only damage is some minor paint burns on the hood and some minor rust on the right front fender where it attaches to the running board. The rest of the car is solid and rust free. California top in great condition.

This car has been stored indoors in an old Willys Jeep Dealership show room in Lisbon, Ohio since purchased by family in 1997 out of London, PA. The car has been worked on several times and appraised by Willis Able. Call Stanley Museum for owner contact information.









# 1923 Stanley Model 740, five passenger touring car, with California top

This car was purchased from Mr. Allen Blazick in 2000, and subjected to a compete restoration, both cosmetic and mechanical, by Mr. Blazick's staff at "Steam and Stuff" in Fremont, California, with most cosmetic items, such as paint, striping and detailing, top, upholstery, etc, being carried out by Stu Laidlaw, who has produced many Pebble Beach quality restorations.

This car is equipped with a 30 HP boiler and Baker burner, and its front seat has been moved rearward by 2" to provide a roomier front compartment. It is in all other respects totally as it came from the factory in 1923.

The restoration is one of the finest restorations to grace a Stanley automobile, and is done in absolutely appropriate colors and striping scheme.

This car participated in the 2012 Steam Car Tour in Stowe, VT, and in the 2016 Tour in Kingfield, ME. Unfortunately, in the latter tour, the boiler and burner were damaged by overheating, and it is expected that a new boiler and burner will be required.

In all other respects this car is believed to be in perfect condition, and its cosmetics are certainly second to none, which bespeaks the results of its restoration, whose fully documented cost was in excess of \$265.000.

A very complete and extensive file accompanies this car, and may be examined by all prospective bidders.












# 1924 Stanley model 750 B, seven passenger touring car serial no. 24044. This car has been driven less than 18,000 miles.

This car is believed to be the 1924 Philadelphia Motor Show car, which accounts for its unusual German Silver condenser shell.

It is equipped with a California top, and a complete set of hard side curtains with sliding glass windows. This car was owned by Mr. Hyde Ballard from 1933, until his passing in 1991. Mr. Ballard was a patent attorney, an early president of the AACA, and had a number of "antique" cars as early as the 1920s, most notably two of Parkard Twin Sixes, a Model T Ford, and then, in 1933, this Stanley 750, and another Stanley. In 1992 or 1993 this car was purchased from Mr. Ballard's estate by Mr. Allan MacNicol, of Grantham, NH and later of New London, NH.

After some years of use, Mr MacNicol turned the car over to Mr. Don Bourdon, of Bourdon Boiler Works in Woodstock, VT.

Between the years 2003 and 2005 extensive mechanical repair, preservation and restoration was executed by Bourdon Boiler Works, and invoices for about \$15,500 detail the work that was done, which consisted of the following:

Built and installed new boiler

Rebuilt burner with new pilot and main vaporizer

Disassembled and cleaned all fuel systems

Rebuilt steam, fuel, feed water, and low water, and low water automatics

Rebuilt throttle

Replaced superheater, steam loop, and steam line using original style fittings

Removed and cleaned water tank, adding top access cover for oil collection

Checked and adjusted engine settings

Repacked all valves

Cleaned all filters

Adjusted brakes

Checked and greased axle bearings

Compounded body and fenders

Road tested

The result was an excellent original car in perfect working condition.

Mr. MacNicol died unexpectedly in July 2005, before taking delivery of the just completed 750 from Bourdon Boiler Works.

The present owner, William Ruger, of Newport, NH, purchased the car from Mr. MacNicol's estate in October of 2005.


The car has been used lightly, but regularly, in the intervening years, most recently in the summer of 2015.

The car has always run very well, and has only required normal maintenance and very minor repairs during Mr. Ruger's ownership, such as reconditioning the rim-wind & rim-set dashboard clock, a new spare tire, and a couple of new batteries.

This car is now ready for reliable touring. A very complete and extensive file accompanies this car and may be examined by all prospective bidders.
